

MESSAGE FROM THE MUNICIPAL MANAGER ON SERVICE PERFORMANCE

MUNICIPAL MANAGER OF LANGEBERG MUNICIPALITY: MR DP LUBBE

The 2022-2023 Financial year has come to an end and we can proudly look back at the performance the municipality has achieved as promised against the IDP and budget.

The Langeberg Municipality is a Category B (local) municipality and exercises its powers and performs its functions in accordance with the legislative provisions of Section 155 and 156 of the Constitution, Act No 200 of 1993 and Chapter 3 of the Municipal Systems Act, Act No 32 of 2000.

Under Section 152 of the Constitution, Local Government is charged to:

- Provide services to communities in a sustainable manner;
- Promote social and economic development; and
- Promote a safe and healthy environment.

The Local Government Elections of November 2021, not only resulted in a new Council, its sub-structures and new ward committees, but also in changes to the demarcation of boundaries in respect of ward boundaries.

The internal Section 56/57 senior managerial structure also saw changes during the financial year, as the vacant position of Municipal Manager was successfully filled.

The position of Director: Engineering Services became vacant. At close of the financial year on 30 June 2023, the recruitment process for a new incumbent for the vacant Director: Engineering position, was well in progress.

The Langeberg Municipality was once again in the fortunate position to receive a "Clean Audit" outcome for the 2021/2022 financial year.

This was the municipality's 4th consecutive and 11th overall, Clean Audit from the Auditor General SA (AGSA). A clean audit means that it is an unqualified audit opinion with no findings and that all legislative prescripts and regulations, were successfully met.

Alignment of Services to IDP Indicators and Council Priorities

Transparency and accountability can only be achieved where there is a clear link between the strategic objectives agreed with the community in the IDP and:

- The budget;
- Service Delivery Budget Implementation Plan (SDBIP);
- Performance agreements of senior management and officials;
- In-year reports (MFMA Sections 71 and 72);
- The Annual Financial Statements;
- Annual performance report.

All these ensure that actual performance is reported against what was planned in the IDP. This is referred to as the golden circle of reporting. Municipalities make use of the SDBIP to integrate the various reports.

Responsibilities, planning initiatives, service delivery implementation, performance measurement and risk management are continuously aligned to that of national, provincial and local municipal goals and objectives.

This process is managed through participation in intergovernmental engagements, adherence to intersecting timelines and scheduled reporting to Council, Provincial and National Authorities. The Langeberg Municipality complied with all these provisions during the 2022/23 financial year.

Risk Management

Langeberg Municipality is committed to the optimal management of risks to achieve its vision and to deliver on its strategic objectives. While conducting our day-to-day business operations, we are exposed to a variety of risks. These risks include strategic and operational risks that are material and require comprehensive controls and on-going oversight.

We have adopted an enterprise-wide integrated approach to the management of risks by embedding the risk management process into key business processes such as planning, service delivery

implementation, and performance management to identify events affecting our objectives and to manage risks in ways that are consistent with the approved risk appetite. To this effect, an enterprise-wide risk management framework was developed and implemented.

To further implement the enterprise-wide approach, we have taken several steps to reinforce a culture of disciplined risk-taking. Council is responsible for oversight of the risk management process and has delegated its day-to-day implementation to the Municipal Manager. The Fraud and Risk Management Committee received appropriate reporting on the municipality's risk profile and risk management process. Management executed their responsibilities as outlined in the risk management strategy. All other officials remain responsible for incorporating risk management into their day-to-day activities. As the Municipal Manager of Langeberg Municipality, I am responsible for enhancing corporate governance within the municipality and to ensure that appropriate focus is placed on important tasks. The risk management process, to review and update the municipality's risk register, continued during 2022/23 with the objective to ensure the relevant risks impacting on the achievement of strategic objectives are accurately identified, assessed, and appropriately mitigated.

Financial Health

Langeberg Municipality prepared a multi-year budget in accordance with the Municipal Budgeting and Reporting Regulations. A provision for the financing of capital expenditure from own funds (CRR) to the total of R59 million, was effected:

- The capital investment funding (own funding) represented 38% of the capital budget.
- Borrowed Funds represented 31% of the capital budget.
- Grants from National government represented 31% of the capital budget.
- Planned borrowing for capital expenditure totaled to R47 800 000.

Service Delivery Improvements

The Langeberg Municipality provided for a total of R156 086 357 to be spent in the 2022-2023 financial year, to upgrade and improve infrastructure within the municipal area. Provision for the following capital expenditure was made in the 2022-2023 budget:

- Water capital assets and infrastructure R15 380 679
- Waste water assets and infrastructure R23 190 249
- Cleansing/ Solid waste capital assets R22 979 275
- Town Planning R 380 000
- Roads and Stormwater R47 639 505 (R30 000 000 loan not received in the financial year. Will be received in 2023/24 financial year and spent in the respective year)
- Electrical Engineering R13 303 528
- Community Services capital assets R14 377 119
- Information Technology R 8 010 000
- Local Economic Development R 2 920 837
- Traffic Service R 2 357 196
- Law Enforcement R 1 314 208
- Other capital assets R 4 233 761

The Langeberg Municipality will be spending a total of R1 184 341 682 in this financial year, to upgrade and improve infrastructure within the municipal area.



IMPROVING ROAD INFRASTRUCTURE

Langeberg Municipality is aware of the current state of our municipal roads and has been actively seeking solutions to address this issue. In addition to our Pothole Repair programme (read the article on page 9), we also came up with long-term solutions.

Within the municipality's 2023–24 capital budget, provisions have been made to rehabilitate and upgrade roads in extremely poor conditions, which will form part of the Road Asset Management Plan.

The allocated funds for road upgrades, repairs, and maintenance projects are aimed at improving the road infrastructure throughout the municipal area, creating a more pleasant and enjoyable driving experience.



FUNDING TOWARDS ROADS IN THE NEW FINANCIAL YEAR

Municipalities road expenditure is funded from a combination of the local government equitable share, municipal own-revenues, EPWP Integrated Grant for municipalities, Municipal Infrastructure Grant, and Public Transport Infrastructure and Systems Grant allocated to road maintenance.

MUNICIPAL CAPITAL BUDGET FOR THE 2023-2024 FINANCIAL YEAR

A tender for the implementation of the Road Asset Management Plan for the Langeberg Municipality is currently in the appeal period before the final award can be made. All tenders received was over the available budget. This will have an impact on what can be completed within the available funding for this project. The project will comprise of the upgrade of existing roads in Robertson, Ashton, Bonnievale and Montagu. It is envisaged that the work will commence in July/August 2023 depending on the weather conditions.

The new capital budget makes provision for R33.35 million that will assist with part of the shortfall towards the operational upgrading of roads.

The 2023-2024 capital budget also makes provision for a second entrance project at Nkqubela, Robertson to the value of R8,06 million. A new entrance on the R317 road between Robertson and Bonnievale will reduce traffic volumes at the existing entrance to Nqkubela. This will greatly improve traffic flow, safety of vehicles and pedestrians.

The upgrade of the MR219 road into Bonnievale is a Provincial Government Project whereby the Municipal budget will contribute a further R2,46 million for the rehabilitation of the section of road between Waterkant Street and the Main Road in Bonnievale.

The following roads are in very poor condition and will form part of the Road Asset Management Plan. The project comprises the maintenance of approximately 14km of surfaced roads as prioritized according to the Pavement Management System (PMS) dated 2019 in Ashton, Bonnievale, Montagu and Robertson.

POTHOLE REPAIR PROGRAMME IN LANGEBERG MUNICIPALITY

Langeberg Municipality is aware of the condition of the roads within our municipal area and has been working on solutions to attend to the matter. One of the short-term solutions is to repair the potholes and clean stormwater channels in the towns according to a Pothole Repair Programme.

Due to the huge backlog in funding for the resurfacing and rehabilitation of our roads, there is an increase of potholes, especially during the rainy season. The much-needed rain not only makes it difficult to fix roads, but the wet conditions also contribute to further deterioration of the road surface.

During this time of the year, we temporarily repair potholes by filling them with a stabilised mixture, to ensure road surface remains in a drivable state as much as possible. The more permanent fixing of potholes will be done as the weather permits.

Langeberg Municipality urges the community to log complaints of potholes, uneven road surfaces, damaged pavements and road signage to the 24/7 customer call centre.

Reported potholes will be added to the Potholes Repair Programme.

Roads with high volume of traffic are prioritised. All potholes reported will receive attention according to the programme.

The civil works team do their best to stay on schedule, but it is subject to the weather and other urgent matters that require the team's attention such at pipe bursts, stormwater issues and breakdowns among other things.

DANGERS OF STREET

• PESTICIDES IN THE

• WESTERN CAPE

The Poisons Information Helpline of the Western Cape has attended to more than 1000 calls regarding poisoning exposures to pesticides.

These pesticides are designed to target and eliminate various pests that can be harmful to human health such as mosquitoes, flies, cockroaches, ants, mice, and rats. Most often, these pesticides are registered for agricultural purposes, not home use and sold illegally to households. These pesticides are often poured into different containers (sachets), unlabelled and used inappropriately.

In South Africa, as in many other developing countries, people live in difficult and crowded areas. These areas are an ideal breeding ground for pests. People seek cheap and effective ways to deal with the problem. The conventional anticoagulant rodenticides require that an animal eat multiple doses of the bait over several days. Street pesticides, on the other hand, are fast working, cheap, easily accessible, effective, and very toxic.

Of the poisoning exposure calls attended during 2022, 49% were accidental and 47% intentional exposure. The rest were due to other causes such as malicious intent. 35% of the calls involved children under 12 years of age. Although most calls were associated with exposures to commercial pesticides, it is difficult to report on exactly what type of pesticides were involved as some are bought on the street as an unknown street pesticide. An example of such is "Halephirimi" ("you will never see the sunset") that is highly toxic. Fifty-eight cases of severe pesticide poisoning were reported to the Helpline and 8 deaths during 2022, but it is estimated that this number could be much higher.

Ms Carine Marks, Director of the Tygerberg Poisons Information Centre advised the following, "If you suspect that someone has been poisoned by illegal pesticides, it is crucial to seek immediate medical attention and take the person to the nearest hospital as soon as possible.

Fast medical care can make a significant difference. It is also vital that healthcare workers report the incident and inform the relevant authorities. Providing authorities with all the necessary details can help initiate an investigation and prevent further incidents."

Furthermore, it is equally important for family and friends to gather all relevant information. Collect any available information about the pesticides, such as the brand name, packaging, or any labels on the containers. If the product is unlabelled take it with to the healthcare facility for possible identification.

Ms Marks concluded, "Ensure that your family and friends avoid further exposure to the pesticide or any contaminated areas. Please cooperate with healthcare professionals and follow their instructions carefully. They will be able to provide specific advice based on the symptoms and circumstances of the poisoning. When the healthcare worker is unsure about the identification and management of the poisoned patient, they will contact the Poisons Information Helpline for further guidance."

About the Poisons Information Helpline of the Western Cape

The Poisons Information Helpline is a 24-hour service for the public and health care workers, provided by the staff of the Poisons Information Centres at Red Cross Children's Hospital and Tygerberg Hospital. The service provides help with poisonings caused by unidentified toxins and advice on managing poisoning by identified substances. The Western Cape Department of Health and Wellness remains committed to strengthening the prevention, diagnosis, and management of poisoning in both adults and children in the province.
