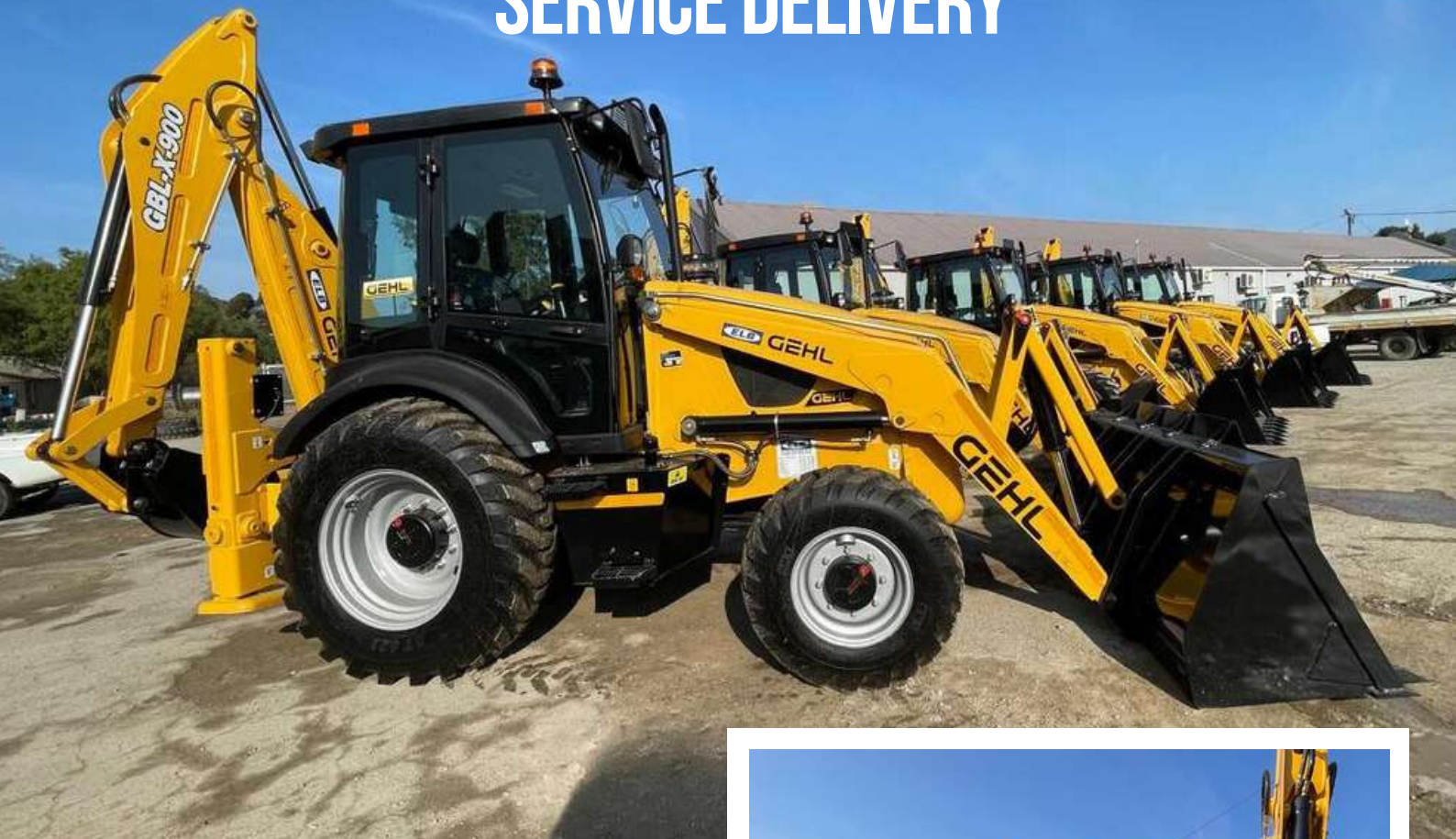

LANGERBERG MUNICIPALITY BUYS FIVE NEW DIGGER LOADERS TO IMPROVE SERVICE DELIVERY



Langeberg Municipality has recently purchased five new digger loaders to improve service delivery in all five towns. These versatile machines will play a crucial role in daily operations, including road and pavement repairs, fixing water pipe bursts, and cleaning stormwater channels.

The new digger loaders are priced at R915,894.17 each (excluding VAT) and represent a significant investment aimed at improving the speed and efficiency of essential maintenance work.

With these new additions, each town will receive a dedicated digger loader, reducing the need for unnecessary travel between towns for maintenance and service delivery operations.

This will better equip the Engineering Directorate to address infrastructure issues and provide reliable services to residents, as each town will receive its own dedicated digger loader.



The digger loader will be stationed at the town, cutting down on unnecessary travelling between towns to be utilised in maintenance and service delivery operations.

This investment is a proactive step towards ensuring that the municipality can meet the increasing service demands and continue delivering on its promise of reliable and efficient infrastructure management.

LEARNERS PLANT TREES THAT WILL CLEAN OUR AIR AND BEAUTIFY OUR SURROUNDINGS

In celebration of the National Arbor Month, the Langeberg Municipality Parks & Amenities Department in collaboration with Department of Forestry, Fisheries & Environment (DFFE) hosted tree planting activities at eight primary schools throughout the Langeberg Municipality.

Arbor Month is a well-established greening initiative to raise awareness about the benefits of trees and plants on our environment.

This year's event aimed to help teach our youth from a young age about the value and importance of tree management and maintenance, showing them first-hand how to correctly plant trees. As the proverb goes, 'as the twig is bent, so grows the tree', which suggests that early influences have a long-lasting effect.

A total of 16 indigenous trees were planted at the schools, which included the Tree of the Year (2024), *Searsia lancea* commonly known as the Karee.

The Karee is a great shade tree, particularly suitable for hot areas like Langeberg, and its non-aggressive root system makes it suitable for planting near paved and tarred surfaces. Residents are encouraged to plant indigenous trees like the *Searsia lancea* (Karee) to help sustain our environment.

KNOW YOUR MUNICIPALITY

3 SPHERES

Did you know that South Africa is a constitutional democracy divided into three spheres of government: Local, Provincial, and National?

The Langeberg Municipality is part of the Cape Winelands District in the Western Cape Provincial Government.

Our municipality's role includes managing administration, budgeting, and planning to prioritise the basic needs of our community.

POPULATION

Langeberg Municipality covers approximately 4,517.4 km² and includes the towns of Robertson, Montagu, Ashton, Bonnievale, and McGregor, along with surrounding rural areas.

According to Stats SA's 2022 population estimates, Langeberg accounts for 10.9% of the Cape Winelands' population, totalling 94,045 people. We support 28,032 households by providing essential services in line with the Constitution.

VISION & OBJECTIVES

To achieve its vision of a safe and healthy environment with high-quality, sustainable services,

1. Ensure efficient administration and good governance.
2. Provide sustainable and affordable infrastructure.
3. Promote a safe and secure environment.
4. Facilitate investment and local economic development.
5. Ensure sustainable financial management.

OUR SERVICES

Over 750 municipal employees are dedicated to enhancing our infrastructure and services. Their work includes maintaining roads, bridges, stormwater systems, irrigation channels, electrical networks, and cemeteries. The EPWP program offers youth valuable work experience in fields such as general work, security, and plumbing. Our teams also focus on law enforcement, public nuisance control, traffic management, firefighting, disaster management, building regulations, and liquor laws. They ensure clean water, effective wastewater treatment, efficient waste removal, and control of air and noise pollution.

BUDGET ALLOCATION

When planning the budget, community needs are captured in the Integrated Development Plan (IDP). This plan is aligned with the available municipal funds and grants from other government departments. For the 2023-2024 financial year, Langeberg Municipality allocated R204 million for infrastructure upgrades and improvements. Our consistent Clean Audit award over the past five years reflects our commitment to effective governance, clean administration, and sound financial management.

THE TO-DO LIST

The Service Delivery Budget Implementation Plan (SDBIP) outlines how services will be delivered and how the budget will be used, as per the Municipal Finance Management Act (MFMA) 2003.

The SDBIP acts as a contract between the administration, the council, and the community. It includes a detailed one-year plan and a three-year capital plan, assigning responsibilities to various departments to ensure services align with the IDP and budget.

MUNICIPAL STRUCTURE

Our municipality has a clear distinction between the political and administrative structures. Led by the Municipal Manager, who oversees service delivery and implements political decisions. The Municipal Manager is supported by the Strategic Management Team (SMT), consisting of Executive Directors from five municipal directorates. The SMT meets bi-weekly to address service delivery issues, review reports, and manage organisational matters.

COUNCIL'S FUNCTION

The elected body responsible for oversight and legislation, comprising 12 Ward Councillors and 11 proportional representatives. The Council is led by the Speaker, with decision-making overseen by the Executive Mayor and the Mayoral Committee. Various committees, including the Executive Mayoral Committee, Portfolio Committees, Municipal Public Accounts Committee, Internal Audit and Performance Committee, and Ward Committees, support the Executive Mayor in managing daily activities.

WARD COMMITTEES

The municipal area is divided into twelve Wards. A Ward is made up of ten blocks, each block being represented by a non-political Ward Committee Member.

To deepen democracy, the Municipality works with Ward Committees, each led by a Ward Councillor, to improve public participation.

HOW TO PARTICIPATE

To help improve our community, your involvement in local decision-making is important.

- Familiarise yourself with your Councillor and Ward Committee Member—they are here to represent you. Connect with them to express your needs and opinions about services.
- Participate in public meetings and the monthly Council meetings to voice concerns.
- Offer input on draft policies, by-laws, budgets, and other municipal documents, advertised in the local newspaper and municipal website.

UNDERSTANDING THE IDP PROCESS

Integrated Development Planning (IDP) is an approach to planning that involves the entire municipality and its citizens in finding the best solutions to achieve long-term development. This is a crucial process that shapes the future of Langeberg Municipality.

Local municipalities in South Africa must use "integrated development planning" to plan future development in their areas. Apartheid planning has left us with cities and towns that:

- Have racially divided business and residential areas.
- Are poorly planned and do not cater to the needs of the poor, who have to travel long distances to work and have poor access to business and other services.
- Have significant differences in the level of services between rich and poverty-stricken areas.
- Have sprawling informal settlements and spread-out residential areas that make service delivery difficult.
- Left rural areas underdeveloped and unserved.

The new approach to local government must be developmental and aim to overcome the poor planning of the past. The IDP approach emphasises developmental planning, focusing on the needs of the poor, and creating a more inclusive and fair future.

Why is it necessary to do an IDP?

There are six main reasons why a municipality should have an IDP:

1. It identifies essential needs, ensuring effective use of scarce resources.
2. It helps speed up service delivery.
3. Strengthens democracy.
4. Helps to overcome the legacy of apartheid.
5. Promotes coordination between local, provincial, and national governments.
6. It attracts additional funds and resources from other spheres of government.

What is the IDP Process?

Before starting the planning process, an IDP Process Plan must be drawn up. This plan is meant to ensure the proper management of the planning process. This plan should outline:

- The structures that will manage the planning process.
- How the public can participate and what structures will be created to ensure this participation.
- The schedule for the planning process.
- Who is responsible for what?
- How will the process be monitored?

Who are the stakeholders who can participate in the IDP process?

- Municipality and Councillors
- Communities and other stakeholders
- National and provincial sector departments
- Everyone in the municipal area can participate. It is about finding sustainable solutions for long-term development.

The IDP Process Timeline

According to Section 25 of the Municipal Systems Act (MSA), each municipality, including Langeberg Municipality, must adopt a single, inclusive, and strategic plan known as the IDP within a prescribed time after the start of its elected term.

Here is a summary of the timeline:

- August: The process plan and time schedule deadlines are set to draft the IDP and budget.
- September/October: Public engagements start on the IDP and Budget.
- November: Government and municipalities talk about policy priorities.
- December: Plans are reviewed and matched with priorities.
- January: Detailed budgets are prepared.
- February: Proposed budgets are discussed.
- March: Public engagements to present the draft Budget for comments.
- April: Community inputs are considered.
- May: Final plans are prepared, and Plans are approved by Council.

Implementing Submitted Inputs

There is a structured process to assess and prioritise submissions. The implementation timeframe depends on factors such as budget availability, project urgency, and legal regulations. Langeberg Municipality follows a structured process outlined in the Municipal Systems Act to assess, prioritize, and implement submitted inputs.

RESIDENTS COLLECTIVELY TAKE RESPONSIBILITY FOR CARING FOR PUBLIC INFRASTRUCTURE

Each year, Langeberg Municipality spends thousands of rands to repair infrastructure vandalism and theft, as well as to clean up as a result of illegal dumping and littering.

All municipal assets have the sole purpose of serving our communities sufficiently and effectively. Beyond the staggering financial losses that directly affect municipal budgets, ratepayers' pockets and service delivery performance, the consequences of vandalism and theft have a direct and negative impact on the quality of life as well as a sense of security for all our residents. Being subjected to frequent electricity outages, water cuts and diminished access to essential public services.

The cost of repairing public assets cannot be justified and increase operational challenges. Recurring repairs are interpreted as wasteful expenditure and result in infrastructure like fences, vandalised toilets, and benches, to be removed rather than replaced.

To protect infrastructure from vandalism and theft, the municipality will need to tighten security measures. Depleting even more of the limited financial resources that should be better spent on infrastructure improvements, expansion and maintenance.

ELECTRICITY SUPPLY

The theft and vandalism of electrical infrastructure have become a major concern which drains Municipal resources. The Municipality is collaborating with the community and engaging private sector security to limit theft and vandalism to electrical infrastructure.

The support of the Electricity Regulation Amendment Bill recently signed into law by President Cyril Ramaphosa, introduces stringent penalties of up to 10 years imprisonment or R5 million in fines for electrical infrastructure vandalism.

To proactively address copper cable theft, R5.5 million will be spent on the first phase of an emergency project to replace copper overhead lines with aluminium, and other infrastructure that are prone to theft and vandalism. The next phases of the project will be executed as the budget allows.

WATER SUPPLY

Insufficient water supply, faulty reservoirs as well as illegal water connections also occur due to vandalism and theft at pump stations. The procurement and labour required to repair such unnecessary damages have left communities without water supply for lengthy periods.

COMMUNITY FACILITIES

Sports grounds, play parks, hiking trails, and cemeteries are common targets for vandalism. This undermines their purpose of providing communities with safe and protected spaces, well-maintained cemeteries and recreational areas that contribute to our well-being. Maintaining a clean environment and functioning public amenities, such as toilets and sports grounds, is also important. However, maintaining and repairing these community facilities remains a challenge.

To address this, many community halls have been secured with new fencing, and upgrading boundary walls with precast walls at sports fields is a priority. Additionally, to enhance security, implementing physical security measures or installing cameras with armed responses at all sports fields and community halls is necessary.

WASTE FACILITIES

Vandalism at waste disposal facilities is a costly operation and we now require such facilities to have permanent security. The misuse or theft of wheelie bins also remains a problem which is time-consuming and expensive to replace.

SANITATION SERVICES

Urgent attention is necessary to address aging infrastructure and preventative maintenance, but the budget is limited due to the high expenses of theft-related repairs at waste water treatment plants.

ROADS AND STORMWATER

Cleaning litter that are dumped in stormwater pipelines is also a timely and costly operation to avoid blockages that contribute to flooding.

Vandalism, theft and illegal dumping are major issues in the Langeberg municipal region, that the municipality cannot address alone. It impacts us all and needs to be addressed by everyone.

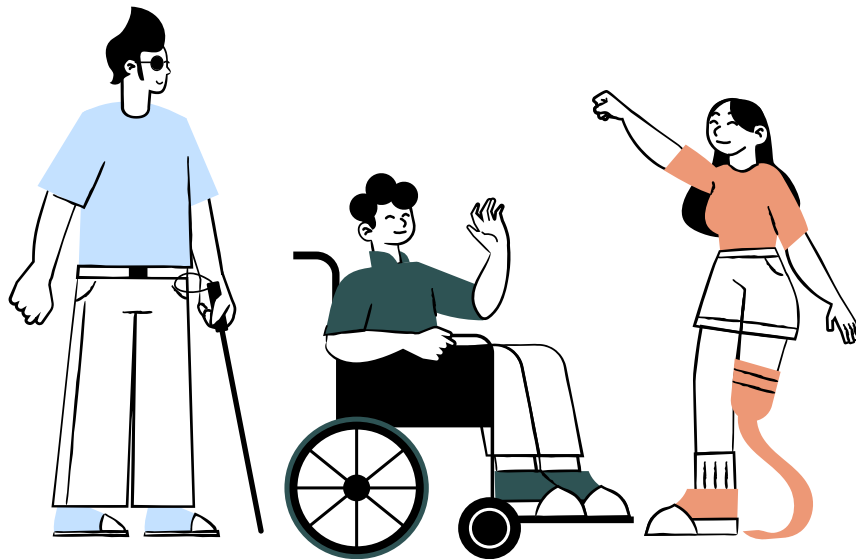

BEAT THE HEAT AT THE ROBERTSON POOL THIS SUMMER

The Robertson Swimming Pool is open and ready to welcome hundreds of visitors this summer. With plenty of lawn space to unwind, picnic, and fire up a braai, it's the perfect spot to cool down. The pool features braai areas available on a first-come, first-serve basis. Capacity for the venue tops out at 850 people, so arriving early is your best bet to avoid possible disappointment.

OPERATING HOURS & FEES

The pool is open from 10:00 to 18:00, Monday through Saturday, and 12:00 to 18:00 on Sundays. Entrance fees are R39.22 for adults and R26.50 for children per day. Frequent visitors can snag a season pass for R535.00 or a monthly ticket for R317.00.

SAFETY & SECURITY

Pool staff and temporary workers are on-site to manage crowd control, monitor access, and prevent unauthorised entry. For added peace of mind, registered security services will be on duty during peak season (15 December 2024 to 15 January 2025). However, please note that lifeguards are not provided, and swimming is at your own risk. Following staff instructions is key to ensuring everyone's safety, especially during busy weekends and holidays.

PARENTAL RESPONSIBILITY

Parents and guardians must always supervise young children while they swim. Stay vigilant, particularly when the pool is packed. Report any suspicious or harmful activity to the pool staff immediately.

A FEW SIMPLE RULES

For a smooth experience, take a moment to familiarise yourself with the pool's depth levels and facility rules. Remember, only proper swimwear is allowed—no jeans, T-shirts, or underwear in the pool.

THE FOLLOWING IS NOT ALLOWED:

- No alcohol is allowed on the premises (please report to swimming pool staff).
- No unnecessary or excessive noise is permitted.
- No pushing people in and around the pool or engaging in any harmful activity around the pool or premises that may cause injury to others.
- No running around the pool.
- No rough playing on the premises.
- No diving into the shallow side of the pool.
- No ball playing on the premises of the facility.
- No balls or bottles allowed in the pool.
- No food or drinks allowed in the pool.
- Do not swim alone (always inform someone).
- Do not use the pool as a toilet.
- Do not swim if your stomach is upset or if you have a skin or respiratory infection.

ALWAYS DO THE FOLLOWING:

- Report any bad behaviour.
- Report vandalism.
- Clean up after yourself.
- Call for help if you notice someone drowning.
- Be considerate of others and your surroundings.
- Look out for yourself and other swimmers.
- Always swim within your ability.
- Check the depth where you can comfortably swim.
- Shower before you swim.
- Wear appropriate sunscreen protection.
- Have fun and be safe.

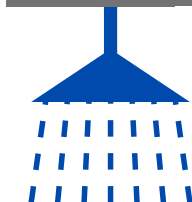

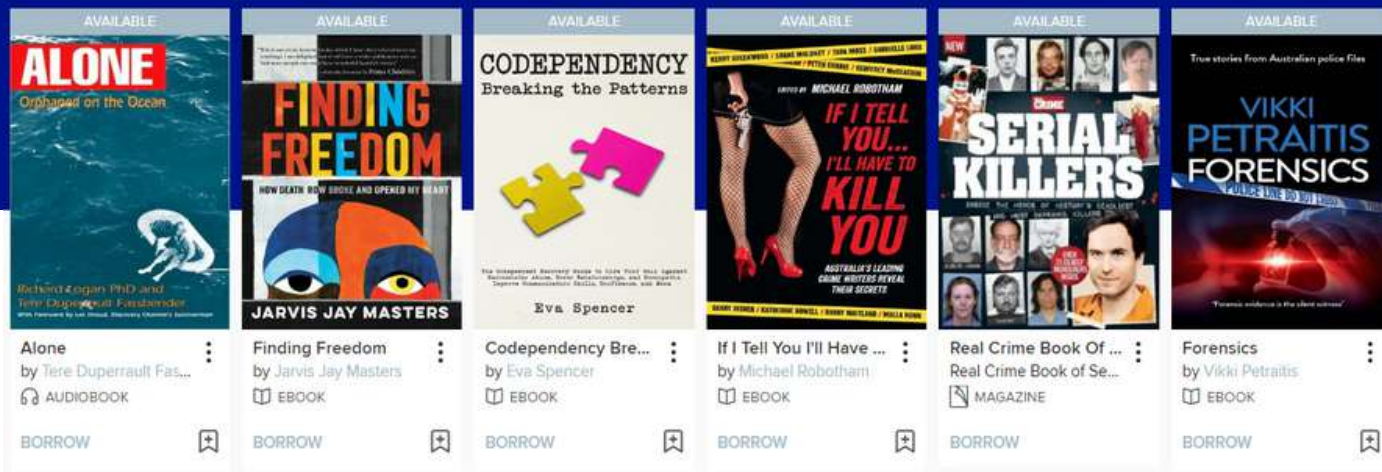

YOUR MENTAL HEALTH IS A PRIORITY

South Africa joined the rest of the world to commemorate World Mental Health Day on 10 October 2024. Whether in our homes, workplaces, schools, or broader communities, mental health should be prioritized as a fundamental human right.

Just like physical health, mental health requires care and attention. Mental health includes our emotional, psychological, and social well-being. It affects how we think, feel, and act; and if ignored, it could even lead to other health problems.

Continued high stress levels, poverty, unemployment, violence, and inequality could contribute to mental health problems.

What are the signs to look out for?

- High stress levels resulting in headaches, lower back pain and general aches and pains lasting for more than two weeks at a time.
- Drastic changes in eating and sleeping habits.
- When a usually social person suddenly prefers to be alone.
- When someone experience prolonged sadness, loss of interest, fatigue and irritability.
- When someone who usually took care of their appearance or self-care, no longer does.
- When someone says they no longer feel the will to keep on living under the circumstances.

Don't suffer in silence. Reach out for help:

If you are experiencing any of these signs or know someone who is, get help immediately by visiting a healthcare provider near you, such as a doctor, local clinic or hospital.

After an evaluation, you will be referred to a service or treatment that best suits your need.

A CALL TO ACTION: WHAT WE CAN DO

1. Raise Awareness and create support networks that foster open conversations and communication campaigns that break down the stigma and promote mental well-being.

2. Workplace Mental Health: Employers can play a crucial role by offering wellness programs, supporting employees in managing stress, and promoting work-life balance.

3. Self-Care and Mental Wellness:

- Do regular exercise as it can release feel-good brain chemicals. Exercising doesn't need to be expensive or take up much time in your day. Find something that makes you feel good.
- Choose a healthy diet including fruits, vegetables and fish or good fats.
- Get enough sleep of 7-8 hours.
- Remain adherent to the treatment programme you and your health care provider have decided on. This means taking your medication and attending all sessions with your counsellor.
- Reach out to family and friends for support.
- Avoid using substances to self-medicate, as it could worsen or create new symptoms.

4. Support those struggling with mental health:

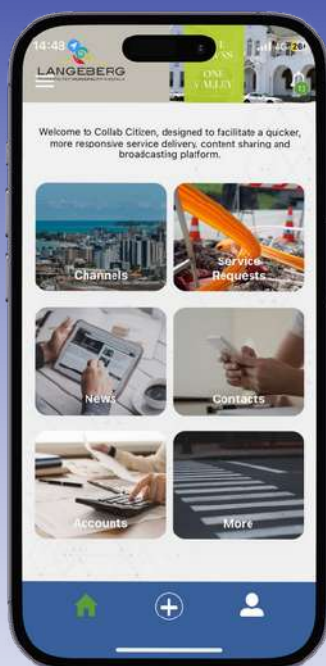
- Mental illness is no different from physical illness - it requires care and treatment.
- Educate yourself about the illness and help break the stigma.
- Acknowledge their distress or suffering, even if you don't completely understand it.
- Work with the treatment team – they have your loved one's best interest at heart.
- Recognize mental health as a fundamental human right, to live a healthy, fulfilling life.
